

Track meet held in Goodland

The Goodland 9-10 track meet held on Monday, April 9, gave a number of the younger Indian tracksters the opportunity to gain experience against other young athletes.

Freshman and sophomore tracksters from eight school, including some 4A schools competed.

The St. Francis boys placed first with a total of 115 points. The St. Francis girls, with a limited number of entries, placed seventh.

In the girls division, Kaycee Williams placed first in the high jump with a leap of 4-2 and in the long jump with 14-0.25. Joni Pevler was the only other Lady Indian who placed.

In the boys division, Trent Raile placed first in the long jump with 19-7.5, Matt Raile was first in the triple jump with 36-7; Trent Kinen was first in the 110-meter high hurdles with 16.27 and the 300-meter intermediate hurdles with 44.19. Also scoring for the Indians were Alex Long, Sam Sowers and Drew Zwegardt.
