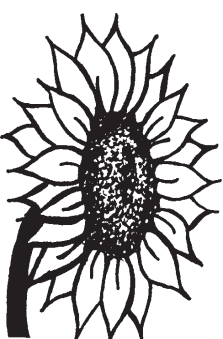

Indians travel to Oakley

The Oakley High School Invitational track meet was held on Friday, April 20, with 13 teams in attendance. Individual tracksters are working hard to increase their skills as the month of May brings thoughts of League, Regional and State competition.

With a total of 64 points on Friday, the Sainty Ladies placed fifth for the day. The first place team was Oberlin with 98.3 points while Triplains came in second with 76 points.

Individual first place finishers for St. Francis in the girls' division include Lauren Ross in the pole vault with 8-6; Sidnee Crabtree in the discus with 103-8.5 and Megan Rice in the 300-meter hurdles with 51.26. The St. Francis 4x400-meter relay team also placed first with a time of 4:26.26. Members of the team include Ross, Elizabeth Gienger, Rice and Melissa Burton.

The Sainty boys earned 58 points for a sixth place finish. Quinter with 79 points outdistanced Oakley by 13 points to earn the first place trophy. Oakley had 66 points and Wheatland/Grinnell 61 for second and third place.

Levi Weeden was the lone Indian to win an event. He placed first in the discus with a toss of 141-00.

"They did a good job," said Tim Lambert, Indian coach.

Burlington defeated Oberlin by six points 89-83 in the girls competition. St. Francis Lady Indian Sidnee Crabtree placed first in the shot put, discus and javelin. Kaycee Williams was first in the high jump and Elizabeth Gienger won the 100-meter dash in the girls division.
