country schoolhouse) project in Haigler. Bail is set at \$1,000 each (total of \$3,000) to release the sisters from their jail sentence. schoolhouse. It will be the only completely restored (inside and outside) one in Dundy County. The schoolhouse will not survive much longer in its current cornfield location.
