# Roles of various organizations discussed May 17

The roles of two similar organizations, the Cheyenne Initiatives Association and the Cheyenne County Development Corporation, were discussed at a board meeting held May 17 in Bird City.

Those attending agreed that the current objectives are to:

- Come along side and assist existing businesses to promote economic development.

- Assist current residents of the county to start their business.

- Recruit new businesses and people to the county.

The Development Corporation is on board with the mission of the Association with manpower and resources to work together. The Corporation will be focusing on budget development to present budget requests to the commissioners and city councils.

They decided that the three main goals of the Development Corporation are to continue with the BRES for St. Francis; create an updated DVD of the county for business and resident recruitment; and to update the county strategic plan.

The question was asked if the Bird City Century II could provide funding assistance to the Development Corporation. Cathy Domsch, coordinator, said she would bring the matter up for discussion at the next board meeting but felt that Century II is supporting the Corporation and county economic development by the work and projects that are taking place in Bird City, even though the foundation is not monetarily supporting. Other projects which could be worked on together could include the DVD, strategies plan, grant writing and marketing.

It was the consensus that the Association is a support system for the Development Corporation. The Association has a two-year plan after that, they may or may not continue to exist. It was suggested that

the Association plan to exist after the two years, especially for the purposes of networking county leaders, meeting at least one time per month to update leaders of meetings that they have been attending and to keep everyone abreast of new or ongoing projects in the county.

Roger Jensen, St. Francis City Council member, made sure that the Development Corporation knew that there were funds available for advertising through the transient tax at the city.

### Vision/mission statements

Tom Keller, chairman, presented the following vision and mission statements for the Association.

Vision statement: Networking Cheyenne County residents with themselves and the world.

Mission statement: Facilitating communication and promoting the most effective and efficient use of all the county's commonwealth resources.

The county's commonwealth resources include but are not limited to: renewable energy, foodshed, education, entrepreneurship, sense of place, leisure and recreation, health, charitable giving, soil and mineral cycle, wildlife and natural world, water cycle, history, arts, spirituality and political power. Both statements were accepted.

The next meeting has been set for 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 14, at First National Bank in St. Francis.
