The St. Francis City Council had an early start of 6 p.m. at the June 19 meeting to reviewed and approved the budget. The regular meeting, which started at 7:30, brought up several issues including the use of the band shell and establishing a website where St. Francis high school alumni can register.

The new procedure for the use of the band shell will be to submit an application at the city hall. The application will still be on a first-come-first-serve basis. In the past it was noted that a wedding had been planned along with an organization wanting the use of the band shell. This procedure should eliminate a similar situation. If a key is needed

for the band shell, there will be a \$25 deposit which will be returned when the key is turned in.

The new procedure will go into effect Sept. 7, but the council noted they are using the application system now.

Mary Lampe, city clerk, noted that having a website which would

list alumni and a brief history would be a "nice plus" for the community. She explained that several communities had this on the internet, but was unsure of how to put it together or if there was anyone willing to tackle the project. She asked that if the council knew of someone interested to let her know.
