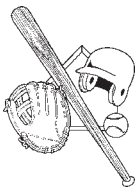


Sainty plays ball

"All of the profit will be sent to needy children through an organization in Phoenix," said Kim Queen, two of the boy's mother.

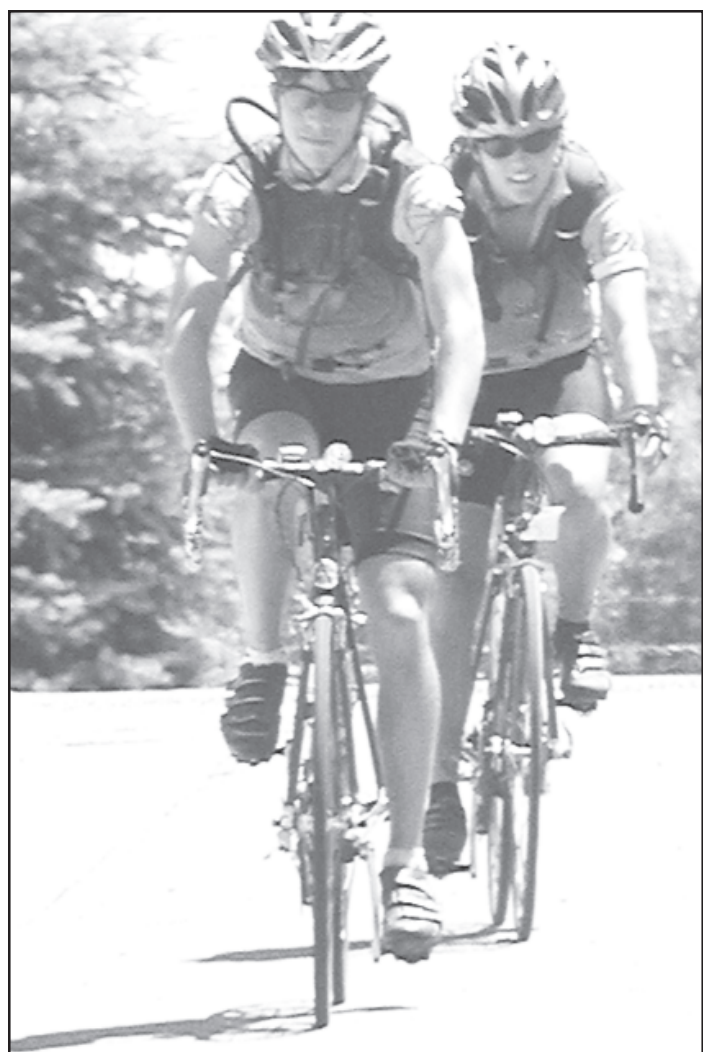
Kids having old toys that are in good condition and would like to donate them to the sale should leave them at the Queen's house at 503 S. Scott in St. Francis.
