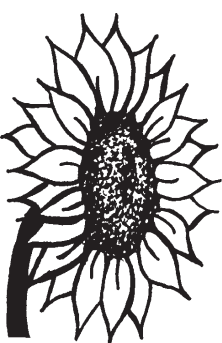

## At the Game



### Team wins three games recently

St. Francis 2 high school boys basketball team finished the regular season by winning three of their four final games. They go into this week's tournament seeded number three. The single elimination tournament begins today (Thursday).

On Thursday, June 14, St. Francis 2 defeated St. Francis 1 by the score of 71-12 but fell to Hitchcock County 57-42. On the final season games on Thursday, June 21, they defeated Atwood 2 by the score of 52-43 and Cheylin 2 60-31.

Members of the team include Ted Crabtree, Keaton Frewen, Chance Holbrook, Trent Kinen, Ben Neitzel, Matt Raile, Trent Raile and Drew Zwegardt.

In the game with St. Francis 1, four Indians scored in double figures with Crabtree and M. Raile each having 18 points, T. Raile had 11 and Kinen 10. Crabtree and Holbrook each connected on a three-pointer with the team managing seven points from the free-throw line.

In the second game on June 14, Hitchcock County had Sainty down 25-18 at halftime and went on for the 57-42 win.

T. Raile led the scoring with 16 points while Crabtree managed 14. T. Raile also had the most rebounds with seven.

Atwood County Challenge Race will be held beginning at 7:30 a.m. on July 4.

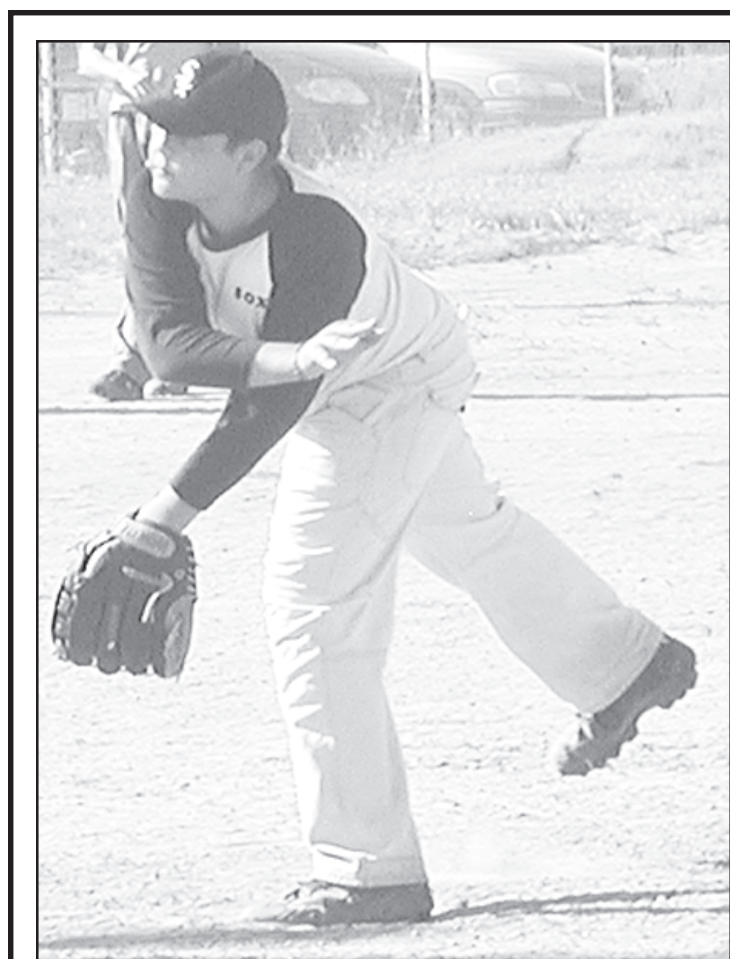
The men will run four times around the lake for a distance of 8 kilometers (5.0 miles) and the women will run twice around the lake.
