Crabtree scored 21 points in this game and he and T. Raile each had five rebounds.

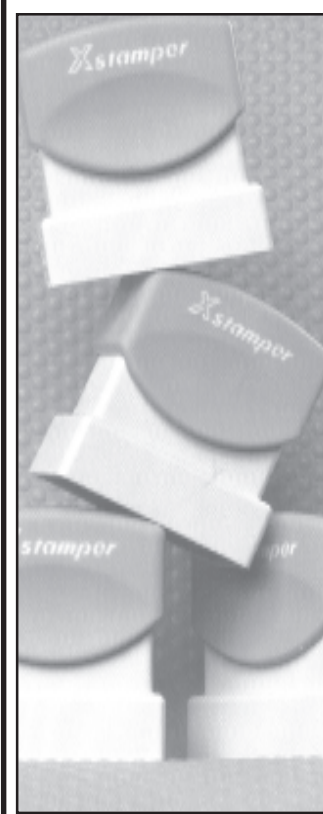
