# Magistrate judge completes course

Robert Van Allen, Cheyenne County Magistrate Judge, recently completed the Special Court Jurisdiction course at The National Judicial College in Reno, Nev.

The college provides judicial education and professional development for the nation's judiciary as well for judges from other countries. It offers the ideal forum for opening new doors and gaining fresh ideas.

The course provides judges with the skill to conduct criminal hearings and trials in compliance with standards; make appropriate evidentiary rulings; communicate well in court and with the media; recognize the psychological profiles of offenders in court; manage unrepresented litigants in criminal and civil cases; appropriately sanction direct and indirect contempt; control potential courtroom disruptions; make appropriate decisions in small claims cases; analyze principles of damages and restitution in civil cases; and apply legal reasoning to analyze the facts of a case. Participants will also identify all of the components of a trial.

on the historic 25-acre University of Nevada, Reno, campus. It is considered the nation's top judicial training institution — a place where insight and discovery occur each day.

Since 1963, the college has awarded more than 74,000 professional judicial education certificates. It offers an average of 95 courses annually with more than 3,000 judges enrolling from all 50 states, U.S. territories and more than 150 countries.
