Officers respond to call

kaenk@nwkansas.com Emergency medical technicians and law officers responded to a call at 3 a.m. Sunday on First Street in Bird City found Wade Lee, 31, dead from an apparently self-inflicted gunshot wound.

His uncle, Gerald Lee, was taken to the Cheyenne County Hospital by ambulance for injuries after falling off of the SUV driven by Wade, then released on Tuesday.

The Kansas Bureau of Investigation dispatched a three member team headed by Agent John Nachtman to the town. Early Tuesday, a spokesman for the bureau would only say that the death had been confirmed and agents were continuing to investigate.

Cheyenne County Attorney Justin Barrett said at this point, no foul play is suspected. He said the men had been to a wedding dance before the incident.

Wade Lee was living in Bird City at the time. He is the son of Gale Lee, Osborne, and Sandy Kuhn, Hays.

"I can't tell much about it now," he said. However, he will be out of commission for four months.

Simmonds joined the National Guard in Goodland while still in high school. Following his graduation from Cheylin High School in 2004, he went to basic training in Fort Jackson, N.C. He was one of three out his class of five boys who went into the service.




