Dirt Can Be Good For You:

A recent study in England has found links between dirt exposure and improvement in mood and immune system. It turns out that the dirt contains a bacteria, mycobacterium, which encourages the brain to increase the output of serotonin.

Scientists believe this study supports some current beliefs about too much hygiene in modern society. These beliefs think that the increase in asthma cases and people suffering allergies is because they are not getting enough exposure to different microorganism. This lack of exposure is thought to weaken the human immune system which, in turn, has a negative effect on mental health.
