ORDINANCE 312
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS; INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION 2007; WITH CERTAIN ADDITIONS AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 309.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS.

Section 1: Incorporating Uniform Public Offense Code. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Bird City, Kansas, that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code," Edition of 2007, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than three copies of said Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy

ORDINANCE 313
An ordinance regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Bird City, Kansas; incorporating by reference the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," edition 2006, providing certain penalties and repealing ordinances numbered 308.

Be it ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Bird City.

Section 1: INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Bird City, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2006, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than three copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 313, and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the city clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative shall be supplied at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2: TRAFFIC INFRACCTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.

(a) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or

Ordinance 542
IN ORDINANCE ATTESTING TO AN INCREASE IN TAX REVENUES FOR BUDGET YEAR 2008 FOR THE City of St. Francis
WHEREAS City of St. Francis must continue to provide services to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this community; and
WHEREAS, the cost of providing essential services to the citizens of this city continues to increase.
NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Governing Body of the City of St. Francis:

Section One. In accordance with state law, the City of St. Francis has scheduled a public hearing and has prepared the proposed budget necessary to fund city services from January 1, 2008 until December 31, 2008.

Section Two. After careful public deliberations, the governing body has determined that in order to maintain the public services that are essential for the citizens of this city, it will be necessary to budget property tax revenues in an amount exceeding the levy in the 2007 budget.

Section Three. This ordinance shall take effect after publication once in the official city newspaper.
