Golf tourney raises money for warmer

Summer is coming to an end but not without the fifth annual "Swing For Your Health" golf tournament sponsored by the Cheyenne County Hospital. The tournament will be held on Sept. 15 with registration beginning at 7:30 a.m. and tee-off at 8:30 a.m. Teams may also register at the door the day of the tournament.

The tournament is a four-person scramble. There will be team prizes as well as special event prizes for:

- Hole 1 - shortest drive.
- Hole 2 - shortest iron.
- Hole 3 - closest to pin on second shot.
- Hole 4 - hole-in-one.
- Hole 5 - longest putt.
- Hole 6 - closest to the outhouse.
- Hole 7 - closest to pin.
- Hole 8 - longest putt.
- Hole 9 - longest drive.

There will be a variety of door prizes given out. Every participant will also be given a "free wedge certificate" worth \$200. The only cost is the shipping and handling.

In 2005, there were 45 businesses and individuals sponsoring the tournament and \$6,200 was raised toward the purchase of a surgical electrocautery unit. This piece of equipment is used to control bleeding and cut tissue during surgery. This year, the money raised

through the tournament will go toward an infant warmer for the labor and delivery room and the obstetric program. The warmer will cost around \$9,000.

There will be a free-will donation lunch of roast beef to be served at Riverside Dining at noon. Family members of participants are welcome to attend.

There are three levels of sponsorships: \$50 - Bronze sponsor; \$100 - Silver sponsor; and \$350 - Gold sponsor.

Board tables the decision to change county fair dates

Changing the weekend of the fair was discussed when the Cheyenne County Fair Board met Thursday. No decision was made because more information was needed.

President Dick Bursch said several people had asked if the board would set the dates and theme for the 2008 fair and parade as soon as possible.

If the fair could be held earlier, it would miss several of the other area county fairs, or perhaps, the board could move the fair up two weeks.

Clay Zimelman, member, said he didn't know how it would be possible to make it earlier with so many on the board involved in harvest. Megan Downing, member, was concerned if there were to be a rain delay they could still be cutting wheat.

Mr. Zimelman also said it would be difficult for the members to be at the fairgrounds getting things ready before the fair. Lacy Reed, treasurer, felt that if the dates were set early enough, plans could be made to get the majority of the work done in April or May. Mrs. Reed also said the harvesters accounts at her business are paid by July 4 and the harvesters were gone.

The other members said even though the harvesters were gone, several of the members were still in the wheat field. Mrs. Downing said that it is very rare that they were ever done by July 4.

Mr. Zimelman asked if they thought the Thresher Association would consider changing the dates of the Thresher Show for the next year as it will fall on July 31. Everyone was in agreement that was probably not an option as the Thresher Show is set and dates are posted on the sign in Bird

City as soon as the show is over.

President Bursch made a phone call to see when Sherman County would be having their fair and how the Tri-State Royal would affect the fair dates. The call was not answered so the board tabled the decision until the Sherman County Fair dates are known.

There were no final figures ready from the 2007 fair. Treasurer Reed said she has been working on them but didn't have them quite complete.

President Bursch said it was an outstanding fair and they were in the black a tiny bit on each event. It was the first time to make a little money on the ranch rodeo.

Gary Cooper, secretary, told the board there was not one qualifying run during the team penning. The contestants were asked if they wanted their entry fees back or what they wanted to do? They said they would donate the entry fees to have an entry office building built. The board discussed several different options and finally agreed to form a committee to get estimates on what it would cost to put up a small building.

Mr. Cooper said that Larry Wilson, superintendent for the goats, had some complaints. Mr. Wilson was told that the goats would be added to the round robin after three years. This is the third year and they were not added. Also the goat pens were thrown together in a hurry and were never finished. The board agreed the pens had never been finished.

A request had been made by one of the superintendents to have all the supers and the board sit down and discuss things that needed changed or improved while it was still fresh in their minds. The goat pens would probably be discussed at the meeting.

Another complaint during the fair was about the big cooler fan that was in the door to Jenkins Hall. People said they did not want to walk past it. The cooler made it very humid in the building and some of the vendors were not happy with it. Mr. Zimelman asked if the cooler could be moved down to the middle of the building by the bathrooms next year. President Bursch said the company told him it needed to be near a door. Several of the members said they had been around these coolers when they are in the middle of the shops and they work fine.

In other business

In other business:

- Mr. Zimelman said Justin Gardner had given a couple of garage doors and two small vinyl windows to the fair board. He thought the windows would work on each end of the crows nest.
- President Bursch said they needed a couple members to measure the land they are trading Butch Ewing. The county attorney just needs the measurement so that a deed can be made. The trade will widen the road around the livestock building and make the parking area deeper on the west side of the road.
- A work day needs to be scheduled to winterize things and put away the benches.
- A commissioner asked that new planks be replaced north of the livestock building.
- The cement north of the livestock barn needs torn out and a smooth slab poured from inside the livestock barn door out a ways to help the cattle come in and out of the barn.
- At the Oct. 4 meeting the board will have election of officers.
