The St. Francis Indians were victorious over Syracuse 49-13 in District football play on Friday night at Greene Field. They now own a 1-0 record in District 14 competition. The other game winner in the district was **Rawlins County who defeated** Wichita County/Leoti. Thus the districts stands with St. Francis and Rawlins County being 1-0 and Syracuse and Wichita County being 0-1.

On Friday night the Indians will meet Wichita County in Leoti (7 p.m.) and the Buffaloes will take on Syracuse. The battle between the St. Francis **Indians and the Buffaloes will** be held in Atwood at 7 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 25.
