St. Francis welcomes league teams

Colby was the winner of the Northwest Kansas League volleyball championship at the tournament held on Saturday in St. Francis. They defeated Oakley in the finals.

The tournament begin with pool play in both the high school and the elementary school.

Colby and Oakley advanced to the finals from Pool A and Rawlins County and Quinter from Pool B.




