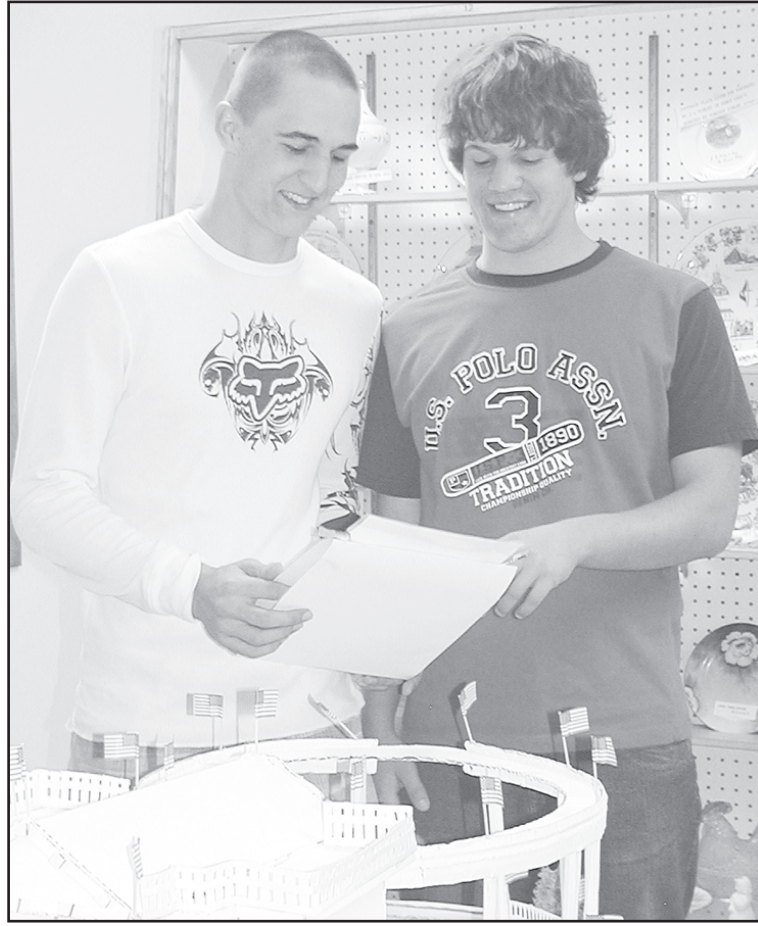

Veterans honored this month at museum

A new monthly display is up at the Cheyenne County Museum! This month, the museum staff is honoring Veterans of the county. Volunteers, Rachel Huffman and Marge Lampe worked hard to get many artifacts to place in the first room of the museum.

Among the display is a replica of the Tomb of the Unknown soldier. This was built when Justin Sherlock and Keaton Frewen were in the eighth grade. They are now seniors, but they remember well the work they had put into the project for Jeff Beims' class.

The building behind the unknown soldiers tomb belonged to General Robert E. Lee of the confederate army during the Civil War. As victors, the North made his home and lands as part of a national cemetery at Arlington as punishment to him and the south. It is also the home of the three unknown soldiers. There are only veterans buried there.

Two well-known people are buried there - President John F. Kennedy, World War II Navy, and actor Lee Marvin, World War II Marine. Another well-known feature is the statue of the flag rising by Marines on the island of Iwo Jima.

The Veterans book, written by veterans and compiled by Betty and Milton Lampe, will be on sale during this time for \$43 plus tax.

Now would be a good time to buy the book.

At the end of the summer, work began on the Good Samaritan Society's St. Francis Village, remodeling rooms in the east-west portion. "The residents, staff and visitors at the Village have endured the remodeling process, and the work is mostly done!" said Rick Reeser, administrator. "Praise the Lord!"

With the help of contractor, Kelly Morris, and architect, Spec Woods, every square inch of space has been used.

Mr. Reeser said he has reduced the number of beds from 51 to 50, and there are now private rooms. The most notable change has been the bay windows with the inset blinds (inset between the panes of glass), which gives the residents more light and cabinet top space for placing pictures, plants, and other favored items

"We are excited to showcase our new remodeling and plan to do that at our resident Christmas party on Thursday, Dec. 13," the administrator said. "We are scheduling this party at 6 p.m., and urge everyone to come and celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ with our residents."

During that time, visitors will be able to view the remodeled rooms and enjoy the Christmas celebration.
