

Indians finish good 11-2 year

The 2007 Indian football team tied last year's record with 11 wins and two losses. Again they were defeated by the Smith Center Redmen in Substate play, this time in Smith Center. Sainty was the 2A District 14 Champions, the Bi-District Champions, the Regional Champions and the Sectional Champions before falling to undefeated Smith Center in the Substate contest.

Seven seniors completed their high school football career after as many as four years on the squad. They include Josh Carpenter, Ted Crabtree, Keaton Frewen, David Guthmiller, Chance Hobrock, Justin Sherlock and RL Walz.

Sainty defeated six out of seven Northwest Kansas League opponents and then added District wins over Syracuse and Wichita County/Leoti on their way to the District title. League wins came over Oberlin, Colby, Goodland, Quinter, Hoxie and Rawlins County (this was also a District win) while the lone loss was to Oakley. After winning the District title, the Indians defeated Hoxie is Bi-District play, Meade in Regional play and Minneapolis in Sectional play.

This is the fourth year that Smith Center has upset the Indians' drive to the State tournament. On Saturday, the Redmen claimed their fourth consecutive 2A championship by defeating Pittsburg Colgan.
