## **Indians play** strong teams before holiday

On Tuesday night the Indians traveled to Atwood to meet the Rawlins County Buffs, the team which won the Sagebrush Shootout. Sainty fell to Rawlins County 56-48.

Thursday the Colby Eagles handed the Indians a 76-50 loss in Colby.

The next competition will take place Friday, Jan. 4, in St. Francis with the Hoxie Indians.

#### **Rawlins County 56** St. Francis 48

Rawlins County/Atwood continued their December winning streak, defeating the Indians 56-48 in Atwood.

Ted Crabtree paced the Sainty with 14 points and had 11 rebounds, 10 of them defensive.


"Atwood was undefeated and beat Brewster by 20 points last Saturday," Coach Ward Cassidy said.

"We had a chance at the end to get them. We just kept working and got them down to a four-point lead with two minutes left and then we just didn't execute.

"Atwood has two good guards and they made 10 three-point shots despite our efforts to get out on them.'

Rawlins County was particularly hot early in the game with 22 points in the first quarter.

Sainty was 4-of-15 from three point range but had a better shooting percentage from the two-point four attempts.



Of the players with more than three attempts from the two-point area, Trent Kinen had the best percentage with 4-of-6 for 66.7 percent.

The team had five blocked shots with Crabtree having three. He also led in assists with four.

"We are still learning to play together but I am very proud of the effort given by all the guys," Coach Cassidy said.

Crabtree scored 18 points in this contest followed by M. Raile with 10. Crabtree also led the Indians in rebounds with 10.

"Colby again has an excellent team with lots of depth and talent," Coach Cassidy said. "We played hard throughout the game and all the guys showed improvement.

#### **Rawlins County 66** St. Francis 46

The first quarter was Sainty's downfall on Tuesday night in Atwood. The Lady Buffs of Rawlins County scored 22 points in the first frame. Even though the two teams played the final three quarters with comparable points scored, Sainty could not overcome the lead Rawlins County built up in the first period.

"We played much better the last three quarters than we did in the first quarter!" Coach Ted Busse said.

"The stat that really hurt was one defensive rebound."

"Rawlins County out rebounded Sainty 35 to 12 and Rawlins County had 14 offensive rebounds. The majority of the time they were able to score by having a second shooting opportunity.

Elizabeth Gienger found the basket for 17 points. She was 6-of-10 from two points range, had one three pointer and was 2-of-4 from the free-throw line.

Sainty's best percentage was from the charity strip as they made 16-of-23 for about 70 percent.

Kaycee Williams took advantage of the free-throw line, hitting 100 percent (4/4). Andrea Holzwarth also was 100 percent with 2-of-2. Three other players were above 50
