New billing begins at county hospital

"We are excited to enter into this so that once a balance becomes the patient responsibility, a statement will be mailed. Since datamailers are generated based on individual accounts, it is possible for one patient to receive multiple statements.

> Patients have the ability to combine account balances by setting up payment arrangements and signing a promissory note. Once a promissory note has been signed, the person responsible for the account will be issued a coupon book, statements will no longer be mailed.

"It is important to note that new promissory notes must be signed in order to combine future balances," Mr. Lacy said.

"Transitioning to the new statements may be a little confusing for patients in the beginning, but we are committed to make this transition as smooth as possible."

The staff at the hospital is working to combine accounts prior to sending new datamailers. Letters will be mailed to notify guarantors of these transactions.

"The Cheyenne County Hospital is committed to provide quality service from patient care to patient billing, Mr. Lacy said. "We are confident this new change will add to our quality.



Notice of Change in billing

You will notice a change in your statements from the Cheyenne County Hospital beginning January 1, 2008. In the future, you will receive an individual statement each time you receive services at our facil-

Once the balance on the account becomes your responsibility, a statement will be generated. The new statements allow you to know what your financially responsible for within a matter of days. If you are unable to pay the amount in full, you will be requested to call the hospital or CBO to establish mutually acceptable payment arrangements.

Once a promissory note is signed, all accounts included in the balance of the note will be combined to one account. You will receive a coupon book containing due dates and amounts as agreed upon in the promissory note; you will no longer receive individual statements on these balances. If new balances occur as a result of services you receive after establishing payment arrangements, you will be required to make new payment arrangements in order to add the new balance(s) to your existing payment plan.
