"Back then, there was little paperwork, no orientation or tests to

take (before starting a job)," she said. "I went right to work." She worked the 6 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Bonnie Straub was honored in other shifts. Today, she is still working the 6 to 2 shift.

Things have changed since she first started working.

With the help of another young girl who was working in the kitchen, she learned to cut up a chicken. Before long, that was easy as they cut up 12 to 15 chickens for a meal.

We were cooking for 80 to 100 residents and employees," she said.

The kitchen store room was across the hall and, in a building to the south of the parking lot, was the large freezer where much of the meat was kept. The staff would take a cart to the building and load up the meats for the week.

The dining room was to the north of the kitchen. There was no steam table so the food was kept on the stove and there were only two ovens.

"I don't think we could live without them," she said.

The dining room was moved to the south of the kitchen and there is a steam table so the residents have hot food.

Karen Moberly, one of the staff, said that Mrs. Straub is fun to work with. Linda Hilt, resident, said Mrs. Straub knows just how to fix her eggs — "easy over and a piece of toast."

Today, the residents have a choice of two entrees, there is a variety of items in the salad bar and there are always breads and desserts.

"We want to please the residents and try to serve them a variety of foods," she said.

The party ended with Mrs. Straub recognizing her family and special friends. She then opened gifts and admired the floral bouquets while the staff served cake,




