# Youth safety poster contest

Adults agree that child safety is an important topic; the trick is getting the kids to agree.

In an effort to reduce accidents by developing "safety-minded" youth, Kansas Farm Bureau has sponsored the Safety Poster Program for over 40 years.

Each year nearly 30,000 youth in grades one through six participate statewide. Posters are judged at the county Farm Bureau level with the winning poster from each of the three divisions submitted for judging at the state level.

"An effective safety poster displays one main idea," said Alisa Rath, county Farm Bureau coordinator.

"We've seen some great posters over the years. It's always interesting to see what safety topics the kids choose."

Divisions are: Grades first and second; grades three and four; and grades five and six. Posters submitted for competition at the state level must have a legible name and address to be judges.

Poster board can be picked up at the Farm Bureau office at 102 E. Washington, St. Francis. Each child entering the contest will be given a pencil pack. The three winners from each division in

Cheyenne County will receive a Kansas Farm Bureau backpack, certificate of achievement and recognition at the annual county
