Sainty places fourth

the Northwest Kansas League wrestling tournament Saturday in Colby. The Indians earned a total of 108 points

"There was only nine points between second place (117.5) and fourth place (108)," Coach Mike Frewen said.

Colby came away with the top score as they collected 230 points. Placing second was Oakley with 117.5, followed by Goodland with "Even though the numbers are

down, the league is still strong," Coach Frewen said. "The top four seeded kids in each weight are quality kids."

Senior Justin Sherlock was the champion at 152 points. Sainty had two other wrestlers in the championship finals who placed second. They are freshman Cody Sherlock at 112 and senior Gavin Smull at 135.

Placing third were Darris Keller and Josh Carpenter while Jesse Pacheco, Scott Ford and David Guthmiller placed fourth.

Coach Frewen had the following comments concerning the day.

"Cody (Sherlock) wrestled real well. He wrestled Sheldon from Goodland who was a state qualifier last year and defeated him. The final match against Wark of Colby was closer than the score

"Darris (Keller) came back after his first match. He stepped up and wrestled well the rest of the day.

"Terrence (Lamb) lost two matches that were close but he got caught on his back. He will meet Vrbas again when we dual Rawlins County.

'Josh (Carpenter) lost his second match to a kid he had beat before. He should have been in the finals. He came back and wrestled well in his third and fourth matches.

"Gavin (Smull) had a good tournament. In the finals, he wrestled Olsen from Colby and the score was closer than the other times they have met. Gavin had a chance to win this match until the very end.

"Jesse (Pacheco) wrestled well against Zweygardt of Colby. This was the first time he has defeated him. Taylor from Colby who wrestled on Team X is good.

"Justin (Sherlock) was the champion in his weight. In the championship match he defeated Rasmussen, a Team X wrestler (Colby) who had upset Deeds from Goodland.

"Scott (Ford) wrestled Rall from Hoxie in his first match and was defeated by a technical fall. He met Rall again in the finals and only lost by 2 points in overtime. He wrestled well after his first



B-team St. Francis 22, **Rawlins County 17**


