Three Sainty players posted the majority of the points with Trent Raile having 17, Trent Kinen 13 and Ted Crabtree 12. Kinen and Raile each had two balls connect from the three-point area which helped with their totals for the evening.

"Trent Raile had his best allaround game of the year with nine rebounds, 17 points, four steals and four assists," Coach Ward Cassidy said. "All of the guys gave great effort.

"We had lots of opportunities to get a stop or score that would have given us the game and we didn't get it done."

Of T. Raile's nine rebounds, five of them were on the offensive side of the court. The team had a total of 11 offensive board and 16 defensive ones. Brewster's total boards were 17.


