Three basketball boys make final appearance

Seniors Ted Crabtree, Keaton Frewen and Chance Hobrock ended their high school basketball career in Brewster on Feb.19 at the 1A Regional tournament. The loss to Brewster eliminated St. Francis from post-season play.

The Indian basketball squad finished the campaign with a 7-11 record.

During the season, they were involved in two tournaments, the Sagebrush Classic in Brewster in December and the Oberlin Invitational in January. They are also members of the Northwest Kansas League and competed with each team in the league plus playing additional games with area schools.

At the Sagebrush tournament, the Indians placed fifth, being defeated by Golden Plains in the opening round. They earned the consolation championship by defeating Cheylin and Triplains in games two and three.


The team also placed fifth in the Oberlin Invitational. They lost to Quinter first, moving them to the consolation bracket where they defeated Oberlin and Rawlins County.

Besides those four tournament wins, Sainty also scored victories over Oberlin, Hoxie and Cheylin during the season.



Besides the tournament action, the team played squads from all Northwest Kansas League schools and several area opponents.
