Boys place second

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The track season opened for the Indians on Thursday at the Wray Quad with teams from Wallace County/Sharon Springs and Burlington also competing.

The Sainty boys were a close second with 79 points. They followed Wallace County by only four points. Placing first were Marvin Miller in the 1600m run, Shawn Warren in the shot put, Trent Kinen in the 300m hurdles and Sam Sowers in the 110m hurdles. Sainty also collected a number of second place finishes including the three relay teams.

Katie Marin in the 100m dash, Elizabeth Gienger in the 200m dash, Sidnee Crabtree in the discus and Mikaela Grace in the 300m hurdles were first place finishers for the Lady Indians. The team placed third with 55.5 points. Burlington won the girls division.

"It was a cold day, but overall we were pretty happy with the competitiveness we showed," Coach Tim Lambert said.

Sainty participated at the Dundy County Invitational on Tuesday with results published next week.

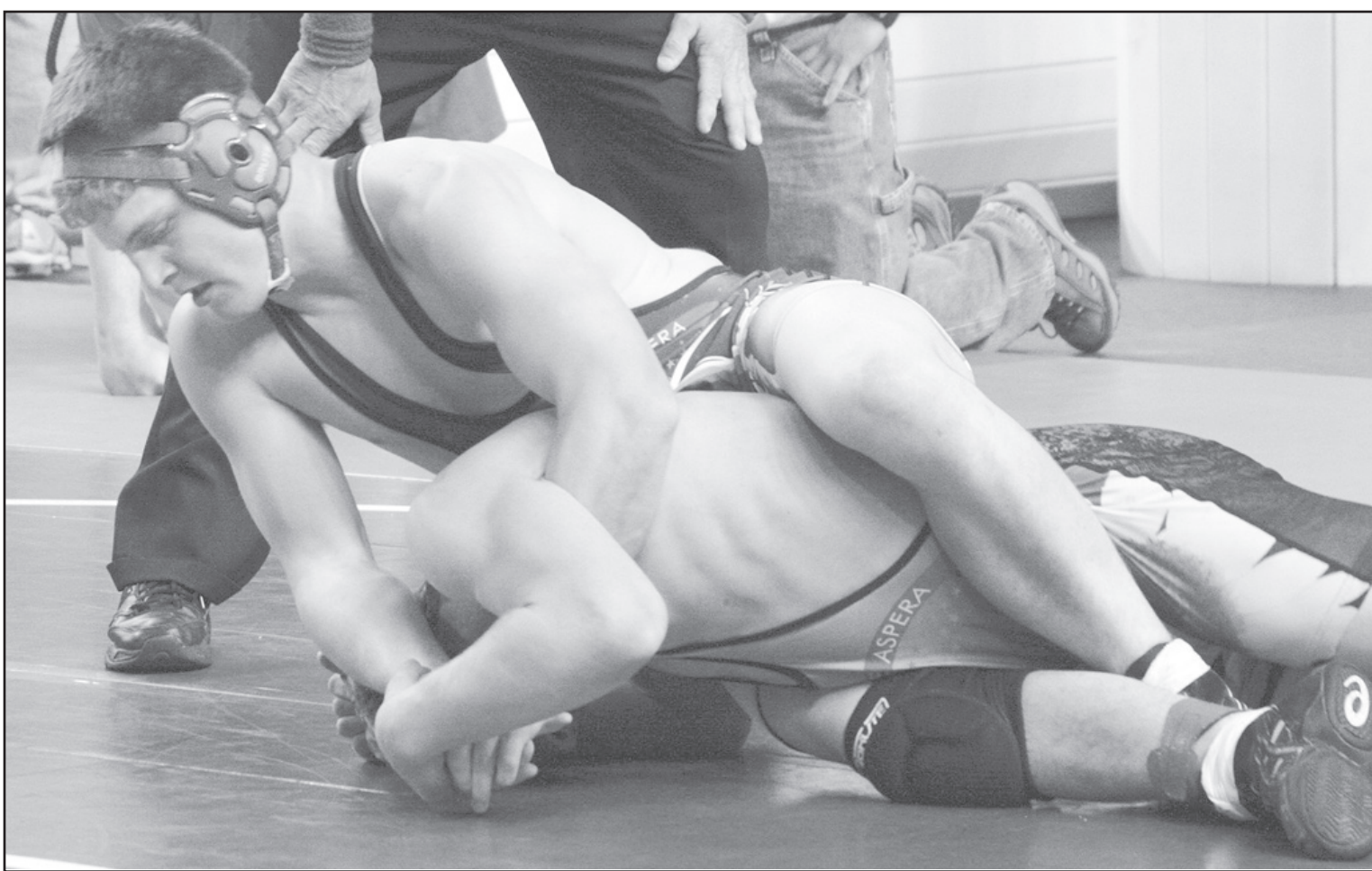
Athletes play 3-on-3 games
