Indians place at Benkelman

St. Francis tracksters were 45.40. among athletes from 10 area high schools who participated in the Dundy County Stratton Invitational on Tuesday, April 1.

The St. Francis boys team finished in fourth place with a total of 68 points, just one point below Hayes Center who placed third with 69 points. Cambridge won the division with 146 points and Dundy County Stratton came in second with 105.

With a total of 29 points, the Sainty girls placed ninth out of the nine girls teams participating. Cambridge also won the girls division with 107.5 points followed by Southwest with 107 points.

Individually Trent Kinen placed first in the 110m hurdles and Ted Crabtree placed first in both the pole vault and the long jump.

Points were given for the top eight places at this event.

The Indians also participated in the Goodland 9-10 Invitational on Monday and the Triplains Invitational in Colby on Tuesday with results printed next week.

Athlete to play ball

Senior David Guthmiller has signed a letter of intent to play football for Sterling College beginning next fall.

Guthmiller, who was mainstay on the Indian football team, earned Northwest Kansas League first team honors both offensively as a running back and defensively as a linebacker following the 2007 campaign. He also received league honorable mention his junior year.

"I'm pretty excited about playing college ball," he said. "I am looking forward to a new opportunity.'

During his senior year, Guthmiller rushed for a total of 1,110 net yards on 234 carries. scoring nine touchdowns and adding two conversion runs for a total of 58 points. Defensively he had 15 unassisted tackles and 82 assisted ones. He was second high on the team in assisted tackles.

"I think my attitude and my work ethic will be a contribution to the Sterling program," he said. "I come from a program which knows how to win."

The last two seasons, when Guthmiller played varsity, the team ended the year with an 11-2 record, losing in post-season play to the future 2A State Champions in the substate games. During the four years he was in high school the Indians won a total of over 40 games and lost less than 10.

He will be joining a college program which had the Sterling Warriors finish the season 8-2 overall and 7-2 in Kansas
