911 board worries about tornado siren

karen.k@nwkansas.com As of Monday, if there is a the middle of the night, the 911 dispatcher will need to contact the on-call St. Francis city plant employee. That person will need to go down to the plant and sound the siren by pushing a button. The siren cannot be activated unless someone manually pushes the button.

This arrangement has worked for a number of years when there was someone on duty at the city plant had a tornado in March 2007 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Today, the city plant employee fortunately, no lives were taken. hours are only in the daytime.
