Phillipsburg won the boys division and Norton the girls division at the Decatur Community Invitational track meet on Tuesday, April 29, in Oberlin. The Norton boys and Rawlins County girls were second.

St. Francis placed fifth in the boys competition with 56 points and the girls were seventh with 39 points.

Ted Crabtree placed first in the pole vault with a leap of 13-0. He also was third in the long jump and second in the triple jump.

In the girls division, Elizabeth Gienger was first in the 200m dash with a time of 27.07. Gienger placed second in the 400m dash with a time of 1:03.86.

Others placing for St. Francis were Trent Raile, Matt Raile, Trent Kinen, Sidnee Crabtree, and Jami Pevler. The only relay team to place was the girls 4x100m with Katie Marin, Pevler, Crabtree and Gienger each running one leg of the race.

St. Francis will attend the Northwest Kansas League meet in Colby on Friday. The Regional meet will take place on Friday, May 16, in Hays.
