Technicians want 4x4 ambulance By Karen Krien been times when they couldn't

The grant has been received to purchase a new ambulance and the emergency medical service director was present to tell the commissioners what the emergency medical technicians had decided

Jannelle Bowers, director, said the majority of the technicians had agreed to purchase a four-wheel drive ambulance. She noted that there were three technicians who did not think a four-wheel drive was necessary. The commissioners said that it would probably be more expensive to purchase plus there would be more costs in servicing, repairing and gas. They also questioned the necessity of a four-wheel drive.

Mrs. Bowers said that it was estimated that a four-wheel drive ambulance would cost about \$3,500 more, which was less than the commissioners had thought. The cost of the ambulance would also need to be within the grant allowance which is \$171,000.

There were five other technicians present: Rod Young, Mike Hanson, Stacy Hazuka, Nancy Semler and Clayton Janicke. Mr. Janicke was one of the three objecting to the purchase.

Mr. Young read a statement about why they needed a fourwheel drive ambulance. He said that only 14 percent of the county roads are paved.

The technicians said there had

reach a patient but, if they would have had four-wheel drive, they could. The commissioners agreed that when the roads are icy, the four-wheel drive would be safer.

The ambulance will be a Bird City ambulance, and, while they have fewer runs, the technicians said they spend more time getting to and from the hospital and it was necessary for them to have the new ambulance. They also said that the technicians in both cities worked as a team and if there was a need for the four-wheel ambulance, it would be available.

The director will be seeking firm bids for the ambulance. The commissioners asked that, if possible, it be a Ford product as that is the dealer in the county. The final purchase will need to be approved by the commissioners but they agreed that they will go with the technicians' recommendation..

The commissioners had been informed that any changes made at the new emergency building in St. Francis should be approved by the city superintendent, J.R. Landenberger. This included the new keyless entry which Mrs. Bowers had proposed at the previous commissioners' meeting.

Since it is hard to get any money in the sale of an ambulance, the commissioners said they had no problem with the technicians keeping the old ambulance for training purposes.
