Pool hours Sundays through Fridays will be 1:30 to 5:30 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m. On Saturdays, the pool will open at 1:30 and close at 5:30 p.m. Lap swimming will be held from 6:30 to 7:30 a.m. Monday through Friday.

Midnight swims for those 14 years of age and older will be held on Thursdays from 10 p.m. until midnight.

Pool manager, Lauren Ross, reminds parents that those children under 4 years of age are admitted free but, they must be accompanied by a person who is 14 or older.

"You are able to exercise every muscle and joint in the body in one workout," instructor, Sheryl Miller said. "Not only does it tone every part of the body, but it also provides a great cardiovascular workout."

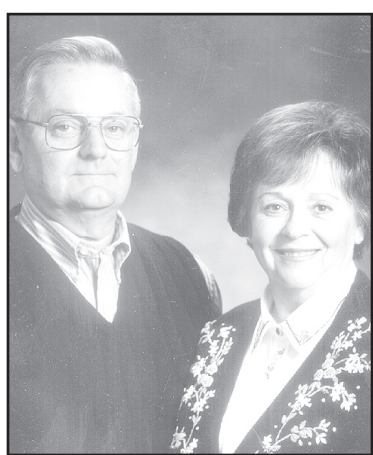
The local Extension office is a great resource.
