Dispatch not given phone numbers

karen.k@nwkansas.com The matter that the city police office phone had not been rolled over to the 911 Dispatch was on the agenda of the 911 Dispatch Board meeting on Thursday.

St. Francis Police Chief had not had the 332-3330 city police telephone number turned over to the dispatch. Following a January meeting with Justin Barrett, county attorney, Mike Day, city attorney, Chief Deborah Farland and Sheriff CraigVan Allen, a letter was sent requesting that all the calls directed to the city police go through the 911 Dispatch. There was a concern that, by the time the calls finally got to the dispatch, there could a disaster or death.

However, the police didn't like that Mrs. Gamblin and the dispatchers would be privy to both the county and city information.

Mrs. Gamblin said that she is very firm that all information which goes though the dispatch is confidential. She said that if a call comes through asking for the sheriff, that call is directed to him with no questions asked (Sheriff Van Allen said he asks that the dispatch find out who is calling him but that is not necessary for all calls made).

Mrs. Gamblin said that, it was her opinion, if the city refuses to roll over the city phone number to the 911 dispatch, then the city should not be on the dispatch board. There is a big concern that the dispatcher can't get ahold of the department if needed.

Officer Jim Walters said he thought that at 5 p.m., the city police phone automatically rolled over to 911 dispatch. He was informed that it doesn't; that it goes to the power plant.


