#### Plum Creek 4-H Club

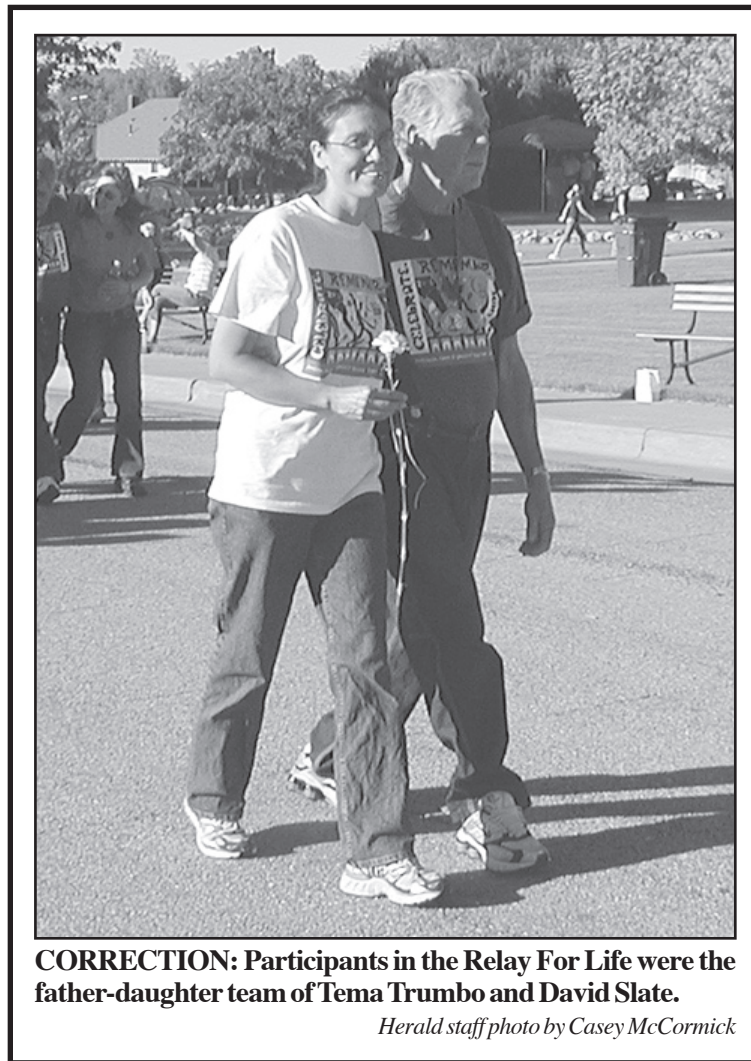

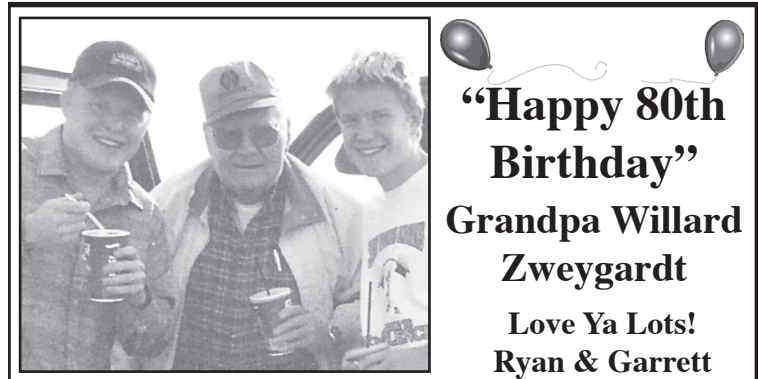
### Classy Classic Red Hatters
