Internet mapping wins a penny for your thoughts

"A penny for your thoughts" recently had people thinking about how to promote U.S. 36. Tom Keller, St. Francis, was the winner of the promotion and received a dinner for two at his favorite restaurant along U.S. 36.

The U.S. 36 Highway Association is committed to promoting the highway and the communities along the route,

said Elmer Kellner, Association director.

But, he thought input was needed. He asked people if they would share their thoughts on a questionnaire and give their ideas on what they thought would better promote the highway.

Mr. Kellner said the penny was a challenge for people to share their thoughts, ideas and concerns. If people included their name, he would give them

a penny as well as a stamp to send the questionnaire.

Questions included: Ideas for encouraging others to travel U.S. 36. What would improve the quality of the highway? What the Association should be doing to help in improving the quality of life and enhance the economic growth of the communities along the highway?

Mr. Kellner's winning idea was for the U.S. 36 Association to lobby internet mapping services and manufacturers of Global Positioning Systems (GPS). He suggested going to mapping services such as Mapquest or Global Positioning Systems such as Garmin and TomTom navigation systems asking them to offer options of the most direct scenic "Americana" route across the midwest which would include U.S. 36.

People haven't heard the end of the "cents" promotion. Next year, Mr. Kellner is offering 2 cents for ideas and thoughts.
