Lions District Governor John Lee of Kismet will conduct his official visitation to the St. Francis Lions Club at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 22, at Main St. Coffee, 216 W. Washington, St. Francis.

Over the past few years, Mr. Workman was on the fast track to a successful country music career with the Nashville Recording Artist, Dixie Road. With four CDs, two music videos and an award winning producer he was playing regularly with country music's biggest acts.

In addition to performing high energy stage shows, Dixie Road was requested to sing their six part, acapella version of the Star Spangled Banner at major league baseball games, NFL football games, Final Four Celebrations and even for the joint chiefs of staff Gen. Richard Meyers.

"These are the kinds of things that happen to you when your career is on the right track," Mr. Workman said.

"This is what I wanted to do from an early age — Until now!"

He slowly started to realize that he was putting Dixie Road first, before God and his family. He decided to use his musical talents given by God to serve God. It was then that Mr. Workman's Christian music ministry began.

He teamed up with songwriter/producer Eddie Kilgallon to begin

recording his new project. One of the first songs to be recorded was a song called, "Let Me Get The Door." The song began being played by a syndicated country Christian radio program called "The Country Parson," heard throughout the country.

Brought up as a Christian, Mr. Workman admits that he never committed to living completely for Jesus until 2001.

"I never stopped believing in Jesus... my position in Christ was present, but my condition

in Christ wasn't very good because I didn't live completely for his will.

"I found myself making decisions that were selfish and not focused on God."

Mr. Workman still plays with Dixie Road but is selective about the time commitments it takes away from his family. His focus is now on using his musical talents to serve God and to be an encouragement to others in their walk with the Lord.
