

Fall festival coming to Goodland

The Goodland Flatlander Fall Festival will kick off on Friday, Sept. 26 with an 18-hole golf tournament at 10 a.m. at Sugar Hills Golf Club and at 6:30 p.m., the Sherman County Speedway will hold the first night of stock car races.

The Brick Top Cruisers will open registration Friday evening at Central Elementary School for the car show.

The Main Street Mile will be closed on Saturday from Eighth to 17th Street, and Wood said he has

been jockeying things around to fill the street without leaving huge gaps.

The street festival will begin at 10 a.m., with vendors, food booths and games for both adults and kids.

The car show begins at 10 a.m., with registration opening earlier at Central Elementary School, 13th and Main. The car show will run through 4 p.m. Saturday, with a Shine and Show on Sunday morning and the awarding of prizes by noon.

The Northwest Kansas Bike Show will open at 10 a.m. on Satur-

day between Eighth and 10th, with registration in the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

A beer garden will open at 10 a.m. and close at 5 p.m. in the building at 1006 Main, Wood said.

KLOE Radio and the Northwest Kansas Animal Shelter will present the annual Scruffy Dog Contest at 11 a.m. at the grandstand on West 11th Street.

From noon to 4 p.m., the grandstand will be the scene for the Flatlander Talent Contest, featuring live music and entertainment.

The second night of stock car rac-

es begin at 5:30 p.m. at the Sherman County Speedway.

Depending on the weather on Saturday, about 8 p.m. the bikers and car show people will parade down Main from Ninth Street to 17th and back to Ninth.

Sunday, the Cruisers will begin the Shine and Show about 9 a.m. The bike club will host a poker run beginning about 8 a.m.

At 11 a.m., the Picnic in the Park begins at Chambers Park, and live music and vendors will be there from noon to 4 p.m.

Following the bonfire, employees from First National Bank will

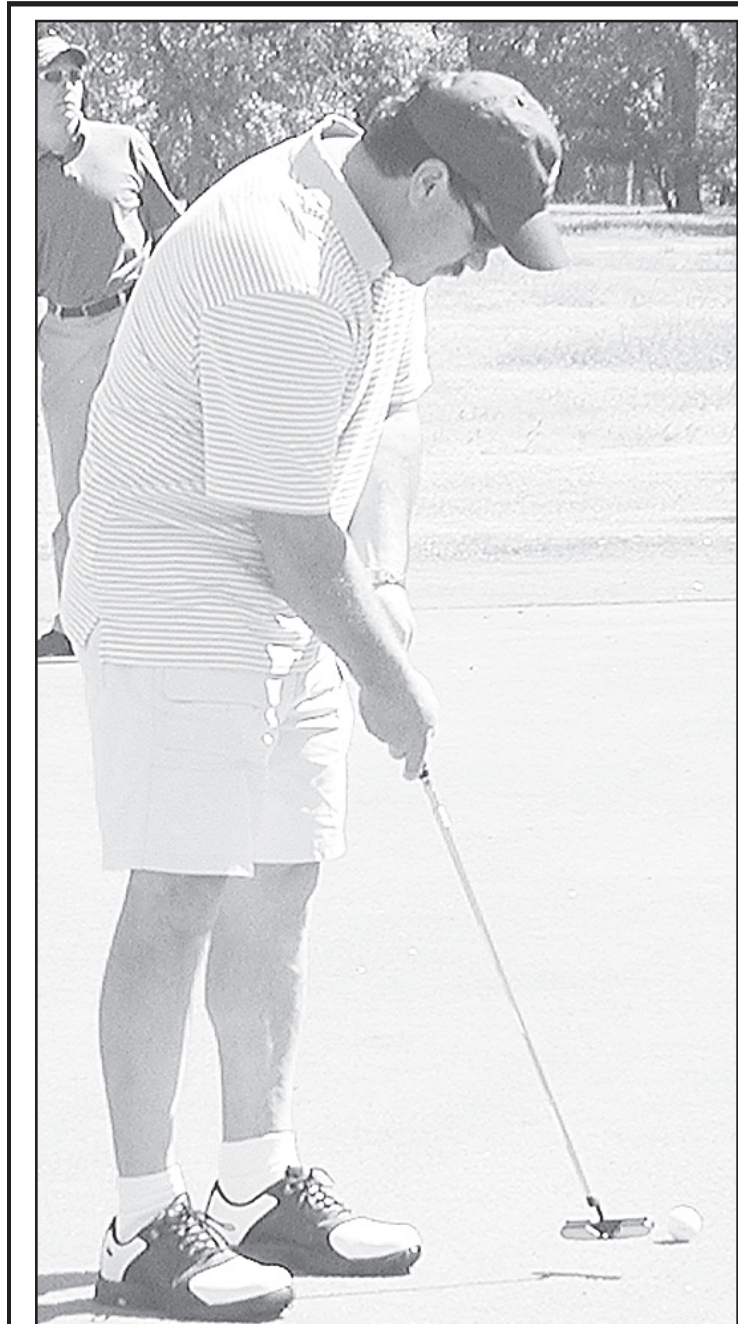
be serving ice cream in the cafeteria.
