Corn harvest is slow; rainfall's over 3 inches

The St. Francis Equity has taken in some corn which was taken off the Raile test plot last week. However, Shirley Zweggardt at the Equity, said the St. Francis area is a little behind in cutting. The corn is still too wet, she said.

The recent rains are also slowing down the harvest, making the fields too muddy.

Kathy Woodcox, St. Francis weather observer, said, as of Monday night, there had been 3.47 inches in St. Francis. However, reports around the area have ranged from

less than 2 inches north of St. Francis to almost 5 inches south of the city.

On Tuesday, the rain gently fell much of the day and there were reports of almost .50 inch.

Sterling College

Ashley Dowgwillo and Lauren Zweggardt, both of St. Francis, will be performing in the upcoming Sterling College production of *Fiddler on the Roof* at 8 p.m. Thursday through Saturday, October 16-18, in Culbertson Auditorium on the college campus.

Dowgwillo, a senior, is the daughter of Craig and Nadja Button and Zweggardt, a freshman, is the daughter of Kary and Kim Zweggardt.

Written first in Yiddish in 1894, and then translated and performed with music under the direction of Jerome Robbins, *Fiddler on the Roof* was the longest-running play in Broadway history until *Grease*. The college production is directed by Gordon Kling and choreographed by Diane DeFranco-Kling.

Fiddler on the Roof tells the story of Tevye, a poor Jew living in Russia in the early 20th century, who

has five daughters, three of whom are old enough to be married. Tradition dictates that they accept arranged marriages, but when each of the three falls in love with a seemingly inappropriate man, Tevye must face a decision: will he force his daughters into unhappy marriages for the sake of culture or will he break tradition himself and allow them to follow their hearts? *Fiddler* is a perfect complement to Sterling College's Homecoming theme - Generation to Generation - as it focuses on a community's ability to change with time yet still pass on the values of its past.
