Be prepared to vote Nov. 4

People wanting to cast their vote early can go to the clerk's office in the courthouse where a voting booth has been set up. People will be able to vote in the booth until Monday, Nov. 3.

On Tuesday, Nov. 4, voters will be able to mark their ballot at Peace Lutheran Church at Jackson and College streets in St. Francis. As in the primary election, all township voting will be held at the church. In Bird City, voters will need to go to the American Legion Hall. The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

This is a presidential year and most people will be glad when the campaigning ends. Besides

the choice of president and vice president, voters will be able to check boxes for United States senate and house as well as the state senator and representative.

There is only one local race and that is for a seat on the county commissioner board. Ray Lee (R), incumbent, and Dale Patton (unaffiliated). One of the men will be the winner in District 2.

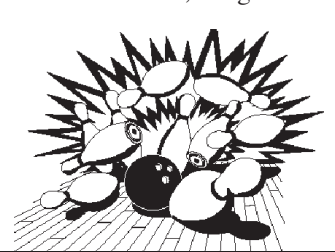

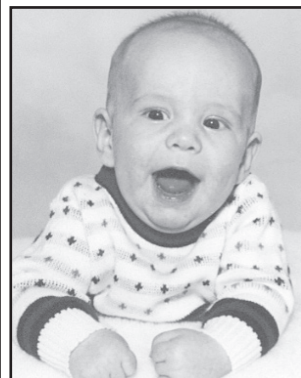
