She went to grade school and high school in Bird City, graduating in 1935. While she was in high school, she met her future husband, Kenneth Loyd Peck. On Oct. 5, 1939, they were married in Bird City. They had four children, Barbara, Douglas, Kenneth Junior and Rebecca. She has nine grandchildren and 14 great-grand-

She was a housewife. During her married life, she lived in Bird City, Atwood and Goodland. In November 2007, she moved to the Good Samaritan Village.


