# Lady Cougars participate in tournament at Brewster

During the Sagebrush Basketball Tournament, the opening game for the Cheylin Lady Cougars and Rawlins County had the Cougars losing 48-66.

Individual statistics include: Whitney Churchwell with 11 points, five rebounds and one steal; Teryn Carmichael scored nine points and had two assists; Ana Ponce had six points, five assists, and four steals; Naomi Reeh had one point, one assist, one steal and two rebounds; Forrest Burr scored two points and had two rebounds; Sydney Busse had six points, two assists and seven rebounds and Tia Sager scored 13 points, had three assists, five steals and two rebounds.

"A disappointing opener for us," said Coach Deb Pochop. "I think it should have been a much closer game, but we just didn't adjust to the pressure. Rawlins County High School caused 41 turnovers and capitalized on them. We also cause 36 turnovers, but did not capitalize on them."

### Cougars vs Triplains

On Dec. 12, in the second round

of the Sagebrush Tourney, the Lady Cougars played Triplains with the final score having the Cougars losing 50-72.

The individual scoring was led by Carmichael with 20 points. She had five assists, one steal and one rebound; Reeh scored 10 points, and had five assists, one steal, one block and four rebounds; Churchwell scored four points and had one steal, five rebounds and four assists; Ponce scored four points and had four assists, five steals and nine rebounds, Burr had three rebounds.

### Cheylin vs St. Francis

The final round of the Sagebrush tourney was played on Saturday against St. Francis. The final score was a 53-52 win for the Lady Cougars.

Sager led the scoring with 23 points, and she had two assists and 15 rebounds. Church-

well had nine points, along with five rebounds, four assists, four steals and two blocks. Reeh scored seven points, and had four assists, one steal and nine rebounds. Busse had six points, three assists and six rebounds, Carmichael, had five points, three assists, three rebounds and one block. Ponce, scored three points and had two assists, one steal and three rebounds and Burr with one rebound.

"Wow! We won a close game, it took the whole team working as a team to win this one," said Coach Pochop. "Tia Sager had an exceptional game as did Naomi Reeh and Whitney Churchwell, Ana, Sydney and Teryn all had a good, solid game and we were down five players at the end of the game so our lone freshman, Forrest Burr, came off the bench and helped to carry home the win."

### McDonald Garden Club

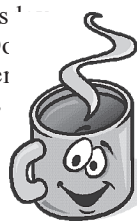

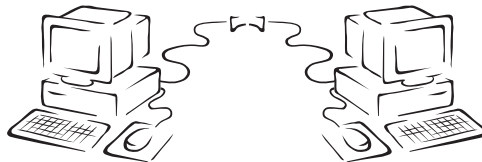
