

### Sam Sowers, 54. Indians play extra contest

The St. Francis Indian basketball team played two games the week of Jan. 19. The Hayes Center Cardinals arrived Tuesday night with their strong team which had only one loss for the year. St. Francis played an 18-point fourth quarter but could not outscore the Cardinals. The final was Hayes Center 74, St. Francis 48.

An additional game was added to the schedule on Saturday when St. Francis played Decatur Community to help give teams involved in the Oberlin Invitational Tournament three games each. The final score of this game was a close Decatur Community 69, St. Francis 65.

#### Hayes Center 74, St. Francis 48

Hayes Center, which is ranked in their class in Nebraska, displayed why they have a winning record on Tuesday night.

They outscored the Indians in every quarter, never letting up on the pressure until the final buzzer.

Trent Kinen with 14 points and Matt Raile with 10 were the leading scorers for Sainty. Kinen had four three-pointers and one other basket to make his total of 14 while M. Raile was 4-of-4 from the free-throw line to add to his two three pointers for his total.

The team as a whole was 9-of-14 at the line, 7-of-20 from outside and 9-of-21 from two-point range. There overall shooting percentage was 39 percent.

Trent Raile with eight rebounds was followed by M. Raile with seven, Kinen with six and Brett Lampe with five. The team had nine offensive boards, 23 defensive ones for a total of 32.

They added seven steals to their defensive stats, along with blocked shots by Kinen and M. Raile.

Twenty-two turnovers affected the offensive play.
