ORDINANCE NO. 555

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING J-TURNS ON DESIGNATED CITY PROVIDING PENALTIES AND ESTABLISHING SECTION 205 TO CHAPTER 14 OF THE 2003 CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOV-ERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, that Section 205 of Chapter 14 of the 2003 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, be established as

14-205. J-TURN PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for any person, while operating a vehicle on Washington or College city streets to make a J-turn. A J-turn is defined as either making a left-hand turn across an on-coming lane or lanes of traffic in order to park at or pull adjacent to the opposite curb from the original direction of travel or backing up from a parked position across an adjacent lane or lanes of traffic to proceed in a direction to the right of the original parked position. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in an amount not less than \$10, nor more than \$50, along with the assessment of court costs.

This amendment to the 2003 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas shall be effective upon its publication in the St. Francis Herald.




