Boys take tough losses

Winter sports teams are beginning to think of playoff time. The Indians will be involved in 2A substate action the first week of March. Between now and then they will finish the regular season at Quinter on Friday night.

The last home game was played on Friday night with Rawlins County, who has a strong boys team. The final score was Rawlins county 73, St. Francis 47.

Sainty also played at home against Wallace County on Feb. 10 with the outcome being Wallace County 63, St. Francis 46.

Goodland defeated St. Francis 76-57 on Feb. 6.

Rawlins County 73, St. Francis 47

The final score was a 73-47 loss by the Indians when they played Rawlins County Friday night.

"I thought we played pretty well against a really talented Atwood team," Coach Jeff Beims said. "We got down early by about 10, and they were able to maintain that margin through most of the game, not widening it much until the very end.

Rawlins County collected 12 three pointers during this contest including seven by Kastens. This meant the Indians not only had to defend against inside shots but outside ones as well.

Trent Kinen had 20 points for St. Francis, followed by Matt Raile with 10. Four other players recorded points in the record

Defensively M. Raile did a good ob blocking shots as he did it six times during the evening.

Sainty had 11 offensive rebounds and 13 defensive for a total of 24 with Kinen having eight and M. Raile and Trent Raile, seven each.

"I feel good about the pace and intensity of our game at this point in the year, but we are still looking for that "complete game" without the meltdowns," Coach Beims said. "A string of about five of those complete games would certainly be welcome this time of year."

46 victory over St. Francis. This was a back-and-forth game in the first half as many of the Indians' games are. Wallace County fell behind with only seven points in the second quarter. The third quarter was the deciding one, as St. Francis could only come up with two points. By the end of three the Wildcats were ahead by 10 points, 43-33.

"Once again we "blacked out" for awhile against Wallace County and it cost us the game," Coach Beims said. "A coach from Sharon Springs approached me after the game and said, 'That's the best four win team I've seen.' At first I thought, "That's some consolation!' After thinking about it though, he's right. We shouldn't be a four-win team, but that is where we find ourselves."

Kinen had 14 points in this game with M. Raile having 12 and T. Raile 11.

'We lost the game on the glass," Coach Beims said. "We were out rebounded by a team that simply out-worked us on the boards, especially in the second half."

Sainty had 24 rebounds, four steals and eight turnovers for the game. Besides being the top scorer

T. Raile scored 25 points for Sainty with M. Raile adding 18. Only two other players scored, D. Zweygardt and Kinen.

"Also, as much as we have improved in the rebounding department over the past couple weeks, we seemed to take a step back," Coach Beims said. "We weren't nearly as aggressive on the boards and it cost us."

Sainty had 24 total rebounds for the game with Kinen having eight. Sixteen turnover were recorded compared to three steals.


> St. Francis 34, **Wallace County 25**
