Regionals set for the weekend

St. Francis will be attending the Ellis Regional wrestling tournament on Friday and Saturday.

Placing in the top four at regionals is the only opportunity for a wrestler to earn a trip to the 3-2-1 A State Tournament in Hays the following weekend.

"It will be an extremely tough tournament," Coach Mike Frewen said. "The Ellis and Beloit regionals are always the toughest. The top six or seven kids in each weight are tough at these two regionals while possibly only the top two in the others."

"When the top six or seven are good, some of the good ones will not make it to state."

"There will be very few easy matches. We hope the wrestlers have peaked at the right time and will wrestle the best they have all year."

"Much of winning is mental. They need to wrestle on an even keel. If they lose they need to shake it off."

"We have wrestled good in the tournaments we have attended this year, so hopefully this will continue."

The St. Francis wrestlers will be headed to regionals with the following regular season records: 112; Freddy Pacheco, 22-11; 119: David Leibbrandt, 7-15; 125: Cody Sherlock 28-7; 130 Terrence Lamb, 30-5; 135: Darris Keller, 19-19; 145: Jesse Pacheco, 23-9; 160: Grady Brunk, 23-14; 171: Scott ford, 21-13; 189: Adam Guthmiller, 16-19.

"We have some good records," Coach Frewen said. "The number of kids that go (to state) could vary from a few to quite a few."

Other teams besides St. Francis and Ellis involved in this tournament include Atwood/Rawlins County, Cimarron, Elkhart, Goodland, Hays/Thomas More Prep Marian, Hill City, Hoisington, Holcomb, Hoxie, Lakin, Larned, Leoti/Wichita County, Montezuma/South Gray, Norton/Norton Community, Oakley, Oberlin/Decatur Community, Rolla, Sublette, WaKeeney/Trego Community.

Goodland has moved down from 4A this year and will be competing against the Indians. Norton won the tournament last year followed by Scott City, who has moved to 4A, Oakley and then St. Francis.

Other regional tournaments for 3-2-1A wrestlers will be held at Beloit, Burlington and Garden Plain.

Regional action begins at 2 p.m. Friday in WaKeeney with many St. Francis fans planning on making the trip to view the competition and cheer on the Indians.

ing the evening to help account for his 16 points. Lampe's 10 points all came in the second half. Four other players helped add the needed points to force the game into overtime.



Ladies compete in final home game

The final game of the regular season will be played on Friday night in Quinter. The Lady Indians will then begin their final preparation for the substate tournament coming up the first week of March.

Two games were played the week of Feb. 9 with both contests being held on the home court. St. Francis lost to Wallace County on Tuesday night (88-63) and to Rawlins County on Friday night (50-40). Friday night was also senior night.

Rawlins County 50, St. Francis 40

The Lady Buffs from Rawlins County took the lead early in the game and completed a 50-40 victory.

St. Francis played with heart throughout the game and on occasion had a scoring run to cut the Rawlins County lead. Actually, scoring wise, Saintry had 24 points in the second half and the Lady Buffs 25. It was during the first half of the game that St. Francis fell behind and never could make up the difference.

The Lady Indians were 26 percent from the field with 17-of-66 shots being successful. At the line they were 38 percent with 3-of-8. The Lady Buffs had many more opportunities at the line than did the Lady Indians.

Elizabeth Gienger had one of her better scoring evenings, coming away with 12 points. She had two three-pointers for half of her total

and then added three two-pointers. The two threes that went through the hoop were from only two attempts. Andrea Holzwarth hit on her only outside attempt also.

Saintry had 20 rebounds, 12 steals and 27 turnovers. The turnovers were more than double the steals which is always a help for the opponent.

Jami Pevler led the team in rebounds with four defensive and one offensive for a total of five. Nine other players also contributed.

"We are going to work on playing with more intensity!!!" Coach Larry Flemming said.

Wallace County 88, St. Francis 63

The Lady Indians worked hard against Wallace County on Tuesday night but unfortunately they were matched up with a good-shooting team. The Lady Wildcats managed between 19 and 27 points per quarter to rack up their 88 points.

Saintry came up with 63 points which would have won a number of their contests this year. It should be noted they had 21 points in the third

quarter, a period which has often been low scoring.

Shayla Hilt scored 14 points and Sarah Trembly 11 points. These girls were aided by nine other Ladies hitting at least two points. S. Hilt had one three, five two's and one free throw (her only attempt) for her points while Trembly had one three and four two's. She had no free-throw attempts.

Saintry was 22-of-55 from the field for 40 percent. They hit 20 two-pointers and two three's for the evening. At the free-throw line they were 47 percent, hitting 17 of 36.

Having the best percentage from the field, with at least four attempts, was S. Hilt with 86 percent (6-of-7). From the free-throw line with at least four attempts Holzwarth, J. Hilt and Marin were each 3-of-4 for 75 percent.

"We played much better as a team tonight!" Coach Flemming said. "The concepts of team basketball and giving 100 percent effort are beginning to take hold."

The team had 30 rebounds with Jami Pevler having seven and Holzwarth six. They also recorded 12 steals. Seven players contributed to the steal total with Williams having three.

"We will continue to work on our skills," Coach Flemming said.
