

Boy Scouts

The Boy Scouts of America is one of the nation's largest and most prominent values-based youth development organizations. It provides a program for young people that builds character, trains them in the responsibilities of participating citizenship, and develops personal fitness.

For nearly a century, the Boy Scouts has helped build the future leaders of this country by combining educational activities and lifelong values with fun. The organization leaders believe that helping youth is a key to building a more conscientious, responsible, and productive society.

Members of Boy Scout Troop 120 in St. Francis during the past year were Jacob Riedel, Matt Whitmore and Logan Whitmore, along with Scoutmaster Jerry Whitmore. Jacob and Matt both achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. They will be planning their Court of Honor's in the near future to celebrate this accomplishment.

Logan has earned the Life Rank and is currently working toward his Eagle Rank. He attended a week-long camp at Coronado Council's Dane G. Hansen Scout Reservation in June. While at camp he was promoted from Brave to Warrior in the Tribe of the Golden Eagle. This is a special leadership program at Camp Hansen. It's purpose is to reinforce the principles of the Scout Oath and Scout Law, develop leadership skills and encourage continued participation in Scouting by recognizing youth and adult camp leaders.



While at camp, Logan earned his Camping, Citizenship in the Nation, Motor Boating, and Indian Lore merit badges. He was also a counselor in training during a second week at camp. With this training he is now qualified to work as a camp counselor.

Scoutmaster Whitmore and Logan are also members of the Order of the Arrow, the national honor society of the Boy Scouts of America. It is recognition of Scouts and leaders selected by their peers as best exemplifying the Scout Oath and Scout Law in their daily lives. Approximately one-eighth of all Boy Scouts are members of the Order of the Arrow.

Community service is an important part of being a Boy Scout. On Halloween, Logan organized a "Trick or Treat So Others Can Eat" food drive for the local food pantry. He enlisted the help of members of his church youth group and, together, they canvassed the town collecting donations of food and money. Other community service projects include performing flag ceremonies for Memorial Day and other local events and helping at the United Methodist Thrift Store each week.

Upcoming events for Troop 120 include a Klondike Derby in February to be held at the River Walk in St. Francis. Logan plans to work as a counselor at Camp Hansen during the month of June. He will also be busy planning his Eagle Project.


