
Wrestler places fifth at tourney

Derek Ross, a member of the University of Nebraska Kearney wrestling team, finished the season by placing fifth in the 285-pound weight class at the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Regional Tournament held on Feb. 28 in

Derek wrestled the first half of the season at 197 and the second half of the season at 285. Derek's first match of the regional tournament was against Justin Glenn of Fort Hays State University and Derek won by a fall.

He then met up with the number one seed, Charlie Alexander of Western State College and lost in overtime 6-4.




The University of Nebraska -Kearney team placed third in the regional tournament qualifying six out of 10 wrestlers for the national tournament.

Two return with state medals

Two Indian wrestlers placed in the top four at the 3-2-1A State tournament held in Hays on Friday and Saturday. Sophomore Cody Sherlock at 125 pounds and senior Jesse Pacheco at 145 pounds each earned a third place finish.

Also qualifying for the tournament were Freddy Pacheco at 112 pounds, Terrence Lamb at 130 pounds and Darris Keller at 135 pounds.

St. Francis, as a team, placed 14th with 36.5 points. Smith Center won the championship with 134.5 points while Beloit place second with 109 points and Norton third with 103 points. 4A this year, placed fourth with 102 points.

"It was a tough tournament," Coach Mike Frewen said. "They get tougher every year and there is a better balance between the wrestlers. There are no easy matches. The first qualifying matches are as tough as the semis.

"The boys wrestled well. We placed two of five and the ones that didn't place are getting closer to being state champion caliber. I hope they hit the weights in the off

"Freddy (Pacheco) lost his first match against Henely of Herington by only three points. There was just one point difference going into the third period. Henely finished sixth in the tournament. Freddy picked up some good experience. Hopefully this will carryover and he will do some weight lifting before next season.

"Cody (Sherlock) wrestled better this week than he did last week and placed third. In the semis he held back a little. He lost to Patton of Wellsville who had been ranked first or second all year. Patton ended up placing sixth. Cody ended up a step higher than last year (he was fourth last year). He had an outstanding tournament and hardly made any mistakes.

Terrence (Lamb) had a fine tournament. The second kid he wrestled was a good kid (Wildin of Marion) who ended up placing second. Against Orr of Hill City, Terrence was leading the whole way until the last 2 seconds when he gave up 2 points to a pretty good kid (Orr of Hill City who ended up fourth).

Darris (Keller) wrestled pretty good and competed hard. He is getting closer to state placing level. He needs to develop the strength for that weight class. He defeated Yoker of Hillsboro. Jesse (Pacheco) started a little

slow but came back in his first match to tie the score and win in overtime. He beat Brown of Plainville who ended up sixth

placed fifth. He had a pretty good tournament. He kept getting better and better, just a little below the eventual state champion. He won his last match against a ranked kid (Wichman of Silver Lake).


