# Landowners may qualify for funds

The U.S. Department of Agri- and construction fields when trees culture (USDA) will provide up to and native grasses are planted and \$145 million to eligible landown- the hydrology of the floodplain is ers nationwide through the floodplain easement component of its Emergency Watershed Protection American Recovery and Reinvest-(EWP) Program, Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced March 9.

The funds will be used to refrequently flooded land to its natural state and create jobs.

Eric B. Banks, Kansas State Conservationist for the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) said that eligible landowners can sign up for these easements until March 27, 2009, at their local Service Center. The conservation service administers Watershed Protection Program.

"The local Natural Resources Conservation Service staff will be working with landowners who voluntarily agree to restore the floodplains to their natural condition by placing their land into easements," Mr. Banks said. "These easements will convert environmentally sensitive lands into riparian corridors and wooded bottomlands that are so vital for fish and wildlife habitat and to mitigate downstream flooding.'

The funding, obtained from the ment Act of 2009, includes both technical and financial assistance to restore the easements. All funds will be spent on targeted projects store an estimated 60,000 acres of that can be completed with economic stimulus monies. The goal is to have all floodplain easements acquired and restored within 12 to 18 months. No more than \$30 million can be spent in any one state. The program's floodplain ease-

ment component allows the Natural Resources Conservation Service to purchase easements on lands damaged by flooding. The restored floodplain will generate many public benefits such as increased flood protection, enhanced fish and wildlife habitat, improved water quality, and a reduced need for future public disaster assistance. Other benefits include reduced energy consumption when certain agricultural activities and practices are eliminated and increased carbon sequestration as permanent vegetative cover is reestablished.


