Good home care can help you feel better faster. Take care of any skin sores, and keep them clean. Take your medicines as directed. and use over-the-counter pain medicines to relieve pain. Avoid contact with people until the rash heals. While you have shingles, you can spread chickenpox to people who have never had chickenpox. Be extra careful to avoid people with weak immune systems and pregnant women and babies who have never had chickenpox.

Zostavox is used to prevent shingles in adults 60 years of age or older. Once you reach age 60, the sooner you get vaccinated, the



once you have it. Talk to your health care professional to see if Zostavox is right for you.

Zostavox may not fully protect everyone who gets the vaccine. You should not get Zostavox if you are allergic to any of its ingredients, including gelatin and neomycin, have a weakened immune system, take high doses of steroids, or are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. Possible side effects include redness, pain, itching, swelling, warmth or bruising at the injeciton site, as well as headache.
