

#### Quick and easy pecan rolls

1/2 cup brown sugar, packed 1/2 cup butter or margarine

1/4 cup corn syrup 2 tubes crescent rolls

2/3 cup pecans, chopped 1/4 cup sugar

1 tsp. cinnamon

Combine brown sugar, butter and corn syrup. Spread on two greased 8 inch square baking pans. Set aside. Unroll rolls into a rectangle, seal seams and perforations. Combine pecans, sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle over dough. Roll up jelly-roll style starting with the long side. Seal edge. Cut each roll into 16 slices. Place cut side down in pans. Bake at 375 degrees for 13 to 17 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pans for a couple of minutes before inverting onto serving plates.




