cial assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). They can re-Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conserva-Kansas organic farmers and those that are transitioning to organic production. While Environmental Quality Incentives Program has always been available for organic producers to treat resource concerns on their land, with the provisions of the new Farm Bill, specific funds are being set aside to assist organic producers.

Applications for Environmental Quality Incentives Program are taken continuously throughout the year, however to be considered for Fiscal Year 2009 funding, producers need to have an application signed and returned to their local Natural Resources Conservation Service office by April 10.

# Funding available for no-till farmers

The Natural Resource Conservation Service is accepting applications for 2009 funding through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) through April 10. Funding is available for practices that have traditionally been funded in the past. There are also new management practice payments and payment rates available in this year's version of the program.

Payments are now available through this program for conversion from a minimum till cropping system (tillage used to prepare a seedbed for one or more crops in rotation) to a full no-till system (no tillage used in any part of the rotation). The 2009 payment rate will be \$13/acre each year for three years to implement a no-till system. Since this program is an incentives program, payments are only available to producers who have not already adopted the practice.

Another change is in payments for temporarily suspending irrigation water use. Payments of \$150/ acre/year for three years are available to eligible producers with irrigated fields in the Quick Response Area (township 5, range 40) in Cheyenne County, while irrigators in the rest of the county can receive \$90/acre/year. The fields can still be used for dryland crop production through this program.
