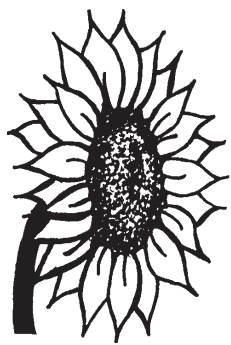


At the Game



Teams compete

St. Francis tracksters were among athletes from 11 area high schools who participated in the Dundy County/Stratton Invitational track and field meet on Tuesday, April 7.

The St. Francis boys team finished in fourth place with a total of 83 points. Cambridge won the division with 115 points, Hayes Center came in second with 107 points and Dundy County/Stratton third with 92 points.

Indian runners, Trent Kinen, Trent Raile, Drew Zwegardt and Matt Raile, captured first place in the 4x100-meter relay with a time of 45.40. Individuals earning a first place finish were T. Raile in the long jump with a leap of 20-00.50 and Kinen in both the 110-meter hurdles and the 300-meter hurdles.

The boys 4x400-meter relay (T. Raile, D. Zwegardt, M. Raile, Kinen) came in second with a time 3:42.30.

With a total of 44,333.33 points, the Lady Indians placed seventh in the meet. Dundy County/Stratton won the girls division with 113 points.

Second place winners were Sidnee Crabtree (discus (100-04) and shot put (36-03.00) and Elizabeth Gienger in the 200-meter dash with a 27.20.

"We were competitive on Monday," Coach Tim Lambert said.

Points were given for the top eight places at this event.

The Indians also participated in the Goodland 9-10 Invitational on Monday and the Triplains Invitational in Colby on Tuesday with results printed next week.

The state of Kansas will be sending four teams to the dual event.

Team members will travel from Lawrence to Des Moines, Iowa, on Friday for weigh in with the competition taking place all

day Saturday and Sunday. The wrestlers will be competition in dual format with teams from all over the United States. Wrestlers were chosen by their finish in tournaments through out the past few months.

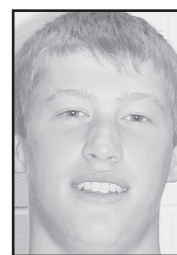

Ball players earn post-season honors

Senior Trent Kinen, St. Francis Indian basketball player, received Kansas 2A All-State honorable mention in both the *Topeka Capital-Journal* and the *Wichita Eagle* following the basketball season. Drew Basgall and Elijah Kastens of Rawlins County were the only other Northwest Kansas League players to be named to the 2A honorable mention list.

The *Salina Journal* printed the final edition of the area high school basketball leaders in a March edition. Kinen, Matt Raile and Trent Raile of St. Francis were among the area leaders.

Kinen was number 10 on the scoring list with 300 points, a 15.0

average per game. He was listed as number seven on the rebounding list with 165 rebounds, averaging 8.3 per game. He played in 20 games this year.

M. Raile was number 19 on the scoring list with 237 points for the season, averaging 12.5 per game. He was number seven rebounding with 158 boards, an average of 8.3 per game. He played in 19 games over the season.

T. Raile, number 24 on the scoring list, put 239 points through the hoop this year in 20 games. He averaged 12.0 points per game. His 131 rebounds had him number 20 on the list. He had 6.6 rebounds per game.

Jami Pevler and Joni Pevler have each signed a letter of intent to play volleyball at York College of Nebraska next fall. The signing took place on April 4.

Joni and Jami were experienced members of the Lady Indian varsity squad and letter winners during their high school career.

Following the final game in October, Lady Indian coach Kent Kechter said, "Jami, a two-year starter, has helped account for a large portion of the passing and attack statistics for the last two years. Joni has showed steady improvement throughout the season and did a good job."

When the final season stats were accumulated Joni had the best percentage serving (20 or more attempts) with 257 attempts, 248 in and a 96 percent of success. Jami led the team with the best percentage setting (40 or more attempts) with 58 attempts, 47 on target, 10 playable, for 98.3 percent.

Joni also had 30 aces and 137 service points while Jami had 20 aces and 107 service points.
